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Dear Families

I hope this letter finds yourselves and your loved ones well. At the end of a very different school year, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the students for their engagement, resilience and achievements in 2019-20, as well as our families for your ongoing support during this final term. Our staff have worked very hard to continue teaching and developing our remote school, as well as work in the provision and in school for the limited return of some students. It has been a remarkable year and we have worked really hard as a community to keep each other safe, as well as provide the best educational experience possible for our students. I am so proud to be leading such a wonderful community, in the wider context of quite challenging times in Brent.

The Government has given the go ahead for all students to return to school full time from September ([Government Guidance here](#)). Many of you will want to know the details of what September will look like. You will find many of the details in the **Reminders / What's new?** section of this letter. I will be outlining the plans that Preston Manor has put into place. We are aware that a significant number of students have not been in school since the middle of March and therefore, we need to convey to you our detailed plans for the recovery curriculum, start of term arrangements, Health & Safety priorities and behaviour standards.

Celebrations

However, normally at the end of the school year, I am writing to you to celebrate all we have achieved this term and I do not want to forget about this. Despite being a remote community, we have many good news items to celebrate together which you can read about in more detail in the End of Term Newsletter (read [here](#)). Some highlights include: remote preparation for university, remote UCAS conferences and enrichment for the Sixth Form, weekly extended writing challenges and word of the week for literacy, Preston Manor eLibrary, viewing free streaming events from our artistic collaborative partners such as the National Theatre and English National Opera, the Behaviour Panel receiving an anti bullying award *All Together Gold Award*, virtual transition events for Year 6 joining PMS in September, a virtual Sports Week with competitions and video events, *The Resilience Challenge* for KS3 promoting our Learning Identity, The Podcast: *Podclass*, Zoom celebrations, and achievement assemblies. Our end of term is Friday 17 July and as is traditional at this time of year, we will have had achievement assemblies for all our students; however, this year these have all been done remotely. We have worked hard to stay connected and thank you to everyone who has engaged 100%!

Summer School Work

This summer all joining new year 7 students have been asked to commit to reading *Go Big: The secondary school survival guide* by Matthew Burton. We also have a whole school Summer read



for students in the upper school and staff: *Ghost Boys* by Jewell Parker Rhodes. You can support this whole school read by ensuring your son or daughter reads a copy from their local library. Please join us and enjoy a very good read which will hopefully stimulate interesting discussions around the dinner table!

If your child is currently in Year 10 or the Sixth Form, teachers will have provided them with independent study tasks to complete over the summer break to help them 'hit the ground running' in September. Please support the school by asking your child if this is the case for them and by ensuring that they complete the work set.

Goodbyes

A number of members of staff are leaving us at the end of term to move onto pastures and challenges new. A special mention must go to Ms Foley and Ms Wilding who will formally be retiring after having been part of the MFL department for 21 and 20 years respectively. However, both are not leaving Preston Manor as they are happily staying on to support students outside the classroom; and Ms Desai who has been a member of the Science Department for 19 years. Other long serving members of staff leaving us this year are Mr Cohen who is leaving the History Department after 12 years, Ms Prescott from the Art Department who is leaving after 6 years, Ms Henderson-Barnes one of our DSDs and part of the PE Department who is leaving after 5 years. I would like to take this opportunity to wish them all the very best in their future careers. I am sure you will join me in thanking all staff who are leaving for their valued contributions to the school.

We are also saying goodbye to Ms Airey, Deputy Head, who has also taught Science for 10 years and Ms Welch, Associate Head, who is leaving after four years at Preston Manor. Ms Airey has a fantastic opportunity to live in Paris and Ms Welch is temporarily leaving teaching to take up a role with Ofsted. Both have been an integral part of the Senior Leadership Team and we will miss them greatly. However, I am pleased to announce that Mr Taylor, Deputy Head, will be Head of Upper School from September. In June we were also very happy to welcome Ms Clarke, a new Deputy Head, to the Leadership Team. I look forward to working closely with both Mr Taylor and Ms Clarke.

Start of term in September

We are staggering the return dates for the various year groups in order to be able to induct students carefully into the new routines and arrangements. There will be lots of new processes for students to become familiar with and as there are 252 students in each year group, we want to ensure this is completed in a robust and rigorous manner.

- **Wednesday 2nd and Thursday 3rd September – Staff Inset days** (no students in school)
- **Friday 4th September** – Year 7 and Year 12 Induction.
We are mindful that each of these year groups did not have their usual induction in the summer term at this key transition point and so this time will be spent completing induction into their new studies. Each year group will receive a further more detailed letter outlining timings and specifics related to Year 7 & Year 12.
- **Monday 7th September** – Year 8, 9, 10 & Year 11 & Year 13 students return with a staggered starting time.

Key Information

In line with Government guidance in order to reopen the school safely, we will: *Comply fully with Health & Safety Guidance, which requires us to assess risks and put in place proportionate control measures.* Essential measures include:

- A requirement that any staff/students/visitors who are ill stay at home
- Robust hand and respiratory hygiene
- Enhanced cleaning arrangements
- Active engagement with NHS Test and Trace
- Measures to ensure reduced potential for contamination, so far as is reasonably practicable. We will ensure reduced contacts across school by:
 1. *Grouping students together in 'year bubbles'*
 2. *Reducing contact between 'year bubbles' by having staggered start/end time, year group zones at break and staggered lunch breaks*
 3. *Arranging classrooms with forward facing desks, where this is practicable*
 4. *Staff will maintain distance from students and other staff as much as possible*

The overarching principle is to reduce the number of contacts between students and staff. This will be achieved by creating the year group bubbles. Maintaining distinct 'bubbles' which have limited mixing makes it quicker and easier in the event of a positive case to identify those who may need to self isolate. We need to have year group sized bubbles for students to resume the full range of curriculum subjects and receive specialist teaching in a secondary school context, Guidance for parents for September return to school can be found [here](#). Again, you will find all our details in the **Reminders / What's New** section of this letter.

And Finally...

I am sure you will join me in thanking both students and staff for an excellent year's work and once again I would like to thank you for your continued help and support throughout this incredibly challenging time. The end of term is finally here and I wish your family an enjoyable, restful and safe break. I am sure that your children will return refreshed and eager to be back at Preston Manor to continue their learning in September 2020.

Start of term arrangements:

Wednesday 2nd September and Thursday 3rd September - staff Inset day

Friday 4th September - School closed to Years 8-11 and 13.

- Year 7 induction (8.35 am – 3pm)

Monday 7th September

This day will have unusual start and finish times - just for induction. Start times will be staggered but may vary from their normal school start time. Students will receive an induction day and recovery curriculum. All year groups will be in school.

Year 7 8.35am - 2.30pm (front gate)

Year 12 8:35am - 2.30pm (back gate)

Year 11 9.35am - 2.50pm (front gate)

Year 13 9.35am - 2.50pm (back gate)

Year 9 10.35am - 3.10pm (front gate)

From Tuesday 8th September we will follow the normal arrival and departure times in the table below.

Tuesday 8th September

All year groups arrive at their normal time as stated below. You will see arrival and departure times are staggered, with year groups entering and exiting from the school premises from different locations. This is to ensure there is no year group mixing. It is vital for everyone's safety that your child arrives promptly to school at the correct time using the allocated gate for their year group to minimise the mixing of year groups.

Timings of the Normal School Day

Years 7, 8 and 9 will attend registration for 25 minutes before moving onto their period 1 lesson. Years 9, 10, 11 and sixth form students will go straight to their period 1 lesson and will have their registration at the end of the day.

Breaktime will happen at the same time for all, however there will be no refreshment available at this time. Students would be required to bring in their own breaktime refreshments if they wish. They will be required to stay in their zone at breaktime.

Lunchtimes are staggered to minimise the contact between year groups. This will enable one year group to occupy the canteen at a time for a hot meal and for each year group to have their own zone to be able to relax and socialise.

Key Health & Safety Information

Health & Safety The following is a summary of key Health and Safety information relating to Covid-19:

- Students must ensure that they wash their hands regularly; when they arrive at school, when they return from breaks, arrive and before/after eating.
- Each group will use separate areas to wash their hands before entering any further rooms in the school building
- Each classroom, dining hall entrance and exit will have a hand sanitizer station. Students will sanitize their hands upon entrance and exit
- Markings on the floor, stairs and signage in all classrooms are visible to aid social distancing in corridors and other spaces that are used
- Social distancing signage put around the school building being used to remind staff and students about social distancing, and hygiene routines
- There will Covid-19 Classroom Protocols displayed in all classrooms.
- School will operate a 1-way system for moving around the M-Block, P-Block and J-Block. Students must follow the one way system at all times.
- Tissues, disinfectant spray and paper towels will be available in all classrooms
- Travel to school – government guidelines advise that students walk or cycle to school on a daily basis. If you are driving into school, please avoid using Carlton Avenue East. We recommend dropping your child off within a short walk from the School to avoid congestion and adhere to social distancing guidelines.
- There will be regular cleaning of touch points and key surfaces around the school, throughout the day.
- Deep cleans will be conducted daily each morning and after school.
- While students in their bubbles do not have to socially distance, we are asking and encouraging pupils to respect each other's personal space.
- We will be enforcing social distancing between students and teachers.

Travelling to and from school

We understand that you may wish to drop your child off and pick them up at the end of the day. However, this will not be possible due to government guidance on social distancing. As such we ask that you meet your child, or drop them off, at least a 5 minute walk away from the school gates.

Where possible, it is **vital that your child walks or cycles** to school and **doesn't use public transport**. If your child **must** use public transport, it is important that your child **wears a face covering** (face coverings are required at all times on public transport (for children over the age of 11)). On arriving at school **students must remove their face coverings**.

The procedures for removing the face covering will be as follows:

- Students remove their face covering as soon as they arrive at school (at the school gates).
- Students must not touch the front of their face covering when removing it (or during use).
- Students must dispose of temporary face coverings in a covered bin or place their reusable face coverings in a plastic bag and then place this in their school bag.
- Students must then wash their hands before heading to their form room or classroom.



Attendance

In March when the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak was increasing, the government guidance made clear no parents/carers would be penalised or sanctioned for their child's non-attendance at school. Now the circumstances have changed the government has updated the guidance for schools and parents/carers. It is vital for all children to return to school in September to minimise as far as possible the longer-term impact of the pandemic on children's education, wellbeing and wider development.

School attendance will again be mandatory from the beginning of the new academic year. This means that the legal duty on you as a parent to send your child to school regularly will apply from September 2020. The usual rules on school attendance will apply and the pastoral team will continue to liaise with our Educational Welfare Officer (EWO).

A small number of pupils may not be able to attend in line with public health advice if they are:

- self-isolating and have had symptoms or a positive test result themselves,
- or because they are a close contact of someone who has coronavirus (COVID-19).

Shielding advice for all adults and children will pause on 1 August. Students on the shielded patient list can return to school, as can those who have family members who are shielding. See the guidance on [shielding and protecting people defined on medical grounds as extremely vulnerable for the current advice](#).

Students who are no longer required to shield but who remain under the care of a specialist health professional should discuss their care with their health professional before returning to school in September. Where children are not able to attend school as parents are following clinical and/or public health advice, the absence will not be penalised.

If your child is unable to attend school or college for the reasons listed above, please contact your child's DSD via email, so that we can offer support whilst your child is not in school.

If you are planning to travel outside the UK during the Summer break you will be required to self isolate unless you are arriving from an exempt country. This is because it can take up to 14 days for coronavirus symptoms to appear. You should check the list of exempt countries before you travel so that your child does not have unauthorised absences from school. If the return date does not allow sufficient time to self-isolate for fourteen days the days absent from school will be unauthorised and a fine could be issued.

If you have a pre-booked holiday to a country requiring self-isolation on return (booked before the 8th of June 2020) and the return day does not allow enough time to self-isolate for 14 days then evidence will need to be provided of when the holiday was booked. The absence can then be authorised and no further action required.

If a holiday is taken to a country that currently does not require self-isolation but this then changes during the summer, the absence can be authorised provided correct evidence is provided (e.g. when the holiday was booked and confirmation that at this time the country was an 'exempt' country).



Illness (inc. Covid-19 Symptoms)

If your child has any of the following symptoms: a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, or has a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia) please do not send them into school and refer to the [Parent/carer's guide to COVID](#) emailed to you in June.

If a child develops symptoms during the school day, they will be moved to the welfare room. They will have no contact with others whilst they await collection. A separate bathroom is available if needed. This room, and bathroom, will be deep cleaned and disinfected before being used by anyone else.

If you have symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), however mild, OR you have received a positive coronavirus (COVID-19) test result, the clear medical advice is to immediately self-isolate at home for at least 7 days from when your symptoms started. In this event it is crucial that you contact the school to let us know.

Students receiving a positive test result will receive a request by text, email or phone to log into the NHS Test and Trace service website and provide information about recent close contacts and inform the school via the reception, clearly indicating the student's name and form class.

After 7 days, or longer, if students still have symptoms other than cough or loss of sense of smell/taste, they must continue to self-isolate until they feel better. Students do not need to self-isolate after 7 days if they only have a cough or loss of sense of smell or taste, as these symptoms can last for several weeks after the infection has gone.

All other household members who remain well must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the household developed symptoms, as shown in this explanatory diagram. Everyone else in the household who remains well should end their isolation after 14 days.

Assemblies

Assemblies are one of the many ways we bring the Preston Manor School community together. Students can expect one assembly per week which covers a range of topical moral and social issues for students to reflect upon.

In light of the government guidance written for secondary schools, we have decided to continue with assemblies remotely, with students being able to watch live year group and house assemblies from their classroom. This will be reviewed in October for the next half term.

Curriculum

Our curriculum will play an important part in helping our students adapt to the 'new normal' in schools. Students will need to alter their behaviour and their interactions with others and will need to process and manage a range of emotions and experiences as they return to school. To support our students to do this, Preston Manor will put in place a recovery curriculum that helps students to make sense of what has taken place, look forward to the future and re-engage in their learning. This will be delivered through form time and PSHE sessions across the Autumn term.



At Preston Manor we have a curriculum that is challenging and ambitious and covers the entire subject spectrum including the Arts. We will ensure that this continues across the school year and that students continue to study their full range of subjects and receive their full allocation of curriculum time, even in the current challenging circumstances.

In the event of a local lockdown or a group of students being required to self-isolate, we will continue to deliver our curriculum remotely using the on-line platform Google Classrooms. Students will benefit from well planned learning sessions supported by audio and video recordings of teacher explanations, as well as regular live taught sessions. Further details on these arrangements can be found in our Remote Learning Plan, which will be posted on our school website.

Home Learning

Home Learning activities are set on a regular basis at Preston Manor and should be recorded by all students in their planner. For the coming school year, **teachers will set home learning on Google classroom** as well as on Go4Schools and **students will be expected to submit their home learning tasks on the Google classroom platform.**

As well as reinforcing and deepening learning which has taken place at school, Home Learning gives students the opportunity to develop their skills as independent learners. In addition, Home Learning is provided for students to practise applying the skills they have learned in lessons. Without this practice, students do not progress as well and reach their potential. Please check your child's planner every day or refer to Go4Schools to help support your child meet home learning deadlines.

If there are any queries or issues regarding home learning, please communicate this with Form Tutors through the student planner in the first instance. We appreciate your support in ensuring the best progress for your son or daughter.

Equipment and Student Planners

As part of our commitment to develop students as independent learners, all students are expected to **be prepared** with the necessary equipment to take an active part in their lessons.

Student planners are a vital means of communication between home and school and should be checked and signed by parents once a week. They should also be used for any routine communication between home and school.



Behaviour in School and the Wider Community

In light of the Covid-19 outbreak, we have amended our Good Behaviour Policy to ensure that students act in a manner that fully supports the safety measures that have been put in place during the COVID-19 pandemic and national crisis. If an action now results in the potential compromising of a person's ability to socially distance and stay safe it will be treated in a more serious manner. Please see below for the new behaviour expectations. Students will be expected to adhere to guidance around social distancing and movement around school, using designated zones of the school as instructed, safely disposing of tissues and not sharing personal items. New Behaviour Expectations

As we start returning to school our behaviour will need to change and be even more considerate to others to make sure we are keeping each other safe.

Our Behaviour Policy is based around three expectations:

- **Be prepared**, ready to learn and give your best
- **Be kind**, respectful and polite to all members of the school community
- **Be safe**, help keep others safe and respect the school environment

Now more than ever, meeting the behaviour expectations is crucial to ensure the safety of students, the school and wider community.

BE PREPARED

<i>Hygiene</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Regular hand washing (including before/after school, breaks etc)
<i>Uniform</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students are expected to attend school in full school uniform as normal. ● If you are unable to purchase any item of school uniform, please write a note in your child's planner to this effect. ● Unfortunately we are unable to loan uniforms to students who forget items. ● Clothes must be washed daily. Uniform no longer needs to be washed at 60 degrees, this is in line with the Government guidance. ● On the day of the week that your child has PE, they can come to school in their PE kit which should consist of: White T-shirt or polo shirt Black or navy plain tracksuit bottoms, non-hooded navy Blue Preston Manor round necked sweatshirt, trainers, plain navy/black outerwear coat/raincoat. Pupils will remain in their PE kit all day and a blazer is not needed if wearing PE kit.

<i>Staying in your bubble</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> You may want to socialise with friends in other bubbles, but this puts everyone, including your family, at greater risk of infection. Be kind and stay in your bubble at all times! By doing this, you are protecting others in the community and those you live with, who may be more vulnerable than you.
<i>Moving around the school</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Always follow the one-way system. Keep to the left when walking down corridors and use the floor markings to be no closer than 2m to others around you. Go straight to your classroom or zone. Avoid touching surfaces such as handrails, door handles etc.
<i>Communication</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Be kind and considerate in the way you speak to others. This is a challenging time for all of us, filled with anxiety and worry that change and uncertainty brings. <i>Social Distancing</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Arrive punctually at your year group's allocated time Remain in your year group zone and base room when required Only use designated entrances and exits when arriving at and leaving the school. Wash your hands upon arrival- before you go to your classroom. Remain in your bubble at all times including break and lunchtimes. Stay in your zone during break and or lunchtime. Only use the toilets assigned to your year group and only use the canteen during designated times. Follow social distancing when doing so. Follow staff instructions at all times. Go straight to school and straight home afterwards. Do not socialise on the way to and from school with any student outside of your bubble.

Uniform

PE (inc. Dance)

Students must wear their PE kit to school on the day(s) they have a practical PE lesson.

The Preston Manor uniform is an important part of the culture and ethos of our school. High standards of dress are expected at all times and students must come to school every day in neat, clean uniform as an indication that they take pride in belonging to the Preston Manor School community. Whenever the school uniform is worn, it must be complete and not mixed with non-uniform clothing.

If you have a missing item of uniform, students must have a note signed by their parent/carer. Any period of time beyond one day may not be authorised. If no note is provided, their parent/carer will be contacted and the student may be sent home to collect the missing/correct piece of uniform.

Expectations for all students

- Plain black leather or leather look shoes (no canvas or shiny patent materials). Kicker shoes are permitted as long as they are black and do not have contrasting stitching, laces or soles. No canvas shoes.
- White shirt tucked in with top button fastened.
- Ties with school logo showing should be knotted conventionally and worn to the waist.
- Navy blue blazers with the school badge must be worn at all times.

Optional Items

- Outdoor coats are optional. They must be navy blue or black and have no logos, patterns or markings (hoods should be kept down in school and must not conceal any part of the face).
- Plain black or blue simple woollen hat may be worn in outside spaces in cold weather at the discretion of senior staff (no other headwear of any kind is permitted and woollen hats must not conceal any part of the face).
- Hair must be worn in an appropriate style that would not undermine the ethos or discipline of the school (e.g. markings cut into the hair or eyebrows, brightly dyed hair or any other extreme of fashion).
- Jewellery is restricted to one pair of small, plain stud earrings and a watch (no nose or other facial piercings of any kind).
- Make-up or nail varnish may not be worn.

For Girls

- Navy blue or black knee length or longer school skirt, or navy blue or black tailored school trousers (no jeans, 'skinny-fit' trousers or leggings).



- Plain navy blue or black religious headscarf (no other headwear of any kind is permitted and headscarves must not conceal any part of the face).

For Boys

- Dark grey or black school trousers (no jeans, chinos or skinny fit trousers).

Mobile phones

Mobile phones are banned at Preston Manor School, however the school recognises the increased use and importance of mobile phones in society and realises that parents may wish their children to carry mobile phones for reasons of safety and convenience in communication on route to and from school.

Students in years 7-11 may be in possession of a mobile phone on site, but it must not be visible and kept switched off at all times (i.e. Including pre-school, break-times & lunchtimes).

Sixth Form students may use mobile phones in school, outside of lesson times, but only in the Common Room area of the Sixth Form Centre.

If a mobile phone is seen or heard:

- Students will be asked to turn their phone off/on silent and show proof they have done this to the member of staff making this request.
- If students continue to use their phone/keep their phone switched on in school, parents will be contacted and the phone confiscated. Parents/carers may be asked to come into school and collect the phone.

Emergency Contact Numbers

Communication between school and parents/carers is vital. This is particularly important in the event of an emergency. Schools are statutorily required to have at least two emergency contacts with a current telephone number for every student. Furthermore much of the information we send during the year is sent electronically, therefore it also crucial that we have an active email address as well.
