

## Special Educational Needs at Preston Manor School (2020/21 Academic Year)

#### **SEND Curriculum and Provision Offer**

Preston Manor School passionately believes in the importance of inclusion and equality for all children and adults, and we strive to ensure that these values are at the heart of our practice. The purpose of our curriculum, and indeed in all our interactions with our students, is to equip them with the skills they need to meet the demands of modern society. We understand that every child is unique and contributes towards the rich culture at our school. Therefore, we actively seek to support and enable our students to make outstanding progress regardless of their learning differences.

The Special Educational Needs Department manages all aspects of additional learning support at Preston Manor School. We recognise that each student has individual ways of learning and we provide extra opportunities and support for students with additional learning needs, both academically and pastorally. As far as possible, we support students with additional needs in mainstream classes where they will continue to have full access to the curriculum. We also offer a robust intervention programme if students require small group or one-to-one teaching. We work together in partnership with parents and children, incorporating their views. Children are listened to and their views taken into account. Home-school partnerships are valued and encouraged. We set suitable learning challenges and ensure ongoing assessment for individuals and groups of pupils.

Preston Manor offers a wide range of Inclusion services, with expert staff in several teams.



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## Staff deployment

The majority of our support (approximately 75%) is deployed into mainstream classrooms where we double staff lessons. They work in collaboration ensuring that all pupils are able to access the curriculum and all pupils are making good progress.

The remaining time is spent delivering specific interventions to pupils who need alternative or extra provision:
