English

Genres: Recounts, Character and setting description, Diary entry

Reading: Apply their growing knowledge of new words to read aloud and to understand the meaning of new terms that they meet.

Writing and spelling: Revising plurals, using silent letters, word endings, descriptive language and homophones.

Write legibly, fluently and with increasing speed.

Grammar and punctuation: fronted adverbials, complex sentences, conjunctions, adverbial phrases, expanded noun phrases, sentence starters, paragraphs, modal verbs, relative pronouns, brackets and clauses.

Key vocabulary:

Number: Place value - using number lines, rounding and mental maths, Column addition and subtraction - using 4 digits and more, Multiply and divide by 10, 100, 1000, Read and write and compare decimals and fractions.

Statistics: Interpret information presented in a line graph, complete, read and interpret information in tables, including timetables.
