English

Genres: Report, biography, instructions and explanations, classic poetry

Reading: Increase their fluency to answer questions about the text and clarify their understanding.. Make plausible inferences and predictions with evidence. Make connections.

Writing and spelling: Use further prefixes and suffixes and understand the guidelines for adding them. Write legibly, fluently and with increasing speed. Writing in paragraphs for specific genres.

Grammar and punctuation: subordinate clauses, relative clauses, fronted adverbials. paragraphs, modal verbs, relative pronouns and clauses

Key vocabulary: Adverb. parenthesis.

Statistics: Interpret information presented in a line graph, complete, read and interpret information in tables, including timetables.

Multiplication and division: Multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1,000. Identifying common factors, prime numbers, square numbers and cube numbers.

Measurement: Measuring perimeter of different shapes. Finding the area of regular and irregular shapes.

Earth and Space

The movement of Earth, and other planets, relative to the Sun in the solar system; the movement of the Moon relative to the Earth; the Sun, Earth and Moon as approximately spherical bodies; use the idea of the Earth's rotation to explain day and night and the apparent movement of the sun across the sky.

Key vocabulary: sphere, rotation, orbit, phases, distance, gravity

Topic: Meet the Greeks

We will be developing our skills in history through our topic.

We will learn about the Greek Empire, the Trojan War, Greek myths and legends and daily life in Ancient Greece. We will examine how Ancient Greece has influenced the world. We will develop our historical skills of evaluating primary and secondary sources and ordering events.
