Some have been able to produce artwork using household materials.


Yr10 students were given the task of doing a series of drawings based on facial features using coffee as their medium.


RESISTANT MATERIALS

Holocaust Survivor Webcast (January 2021)

Staff and Sixth formers were invited to hear from Holocaust Survivor Eve Kugler BEM in conversation with Natasha Kaplinsky OBE, hosted by the Holocaust Educational Trust. This opportunity from the History department, was provided remotely which meant that all students had the opportunity to attend, listen to Eve's testimony, and ask questions about her experiences, alongside other students across the country. It was a fantastic opportunity, one that students were grateful to have, understanding that there are very few survivors left to hear testimony from. Eve's story was moving and inspiring and gave a real platform to students to consider the History of the Holocaust, the day before Holocaust Memorial Day.



On 1st of February 2021, 111 year 10 and 11 pupils participated in JMC as it moved online for the first time. Tens of thousands of pupils entered the national competition, which aims to promote mathematical problem solving in pupils. Only the top-scoring participants qualify for a bronze, silver or gold certificate. As a School we have achieved 11 SILVER and 19 BRONZE certificates. Congratulations to all who took part.


