From September 2013 the government are allocating funding directly to primary schools to support the provision of P.E./sport. Each school now receives £16,000 plus an extra £10 per pupil per annum. We are aware that one in three eleven year olds in our area are overweight and/ obese and believe that P.E./Sporting activity is key to promoting healthier life choices.
