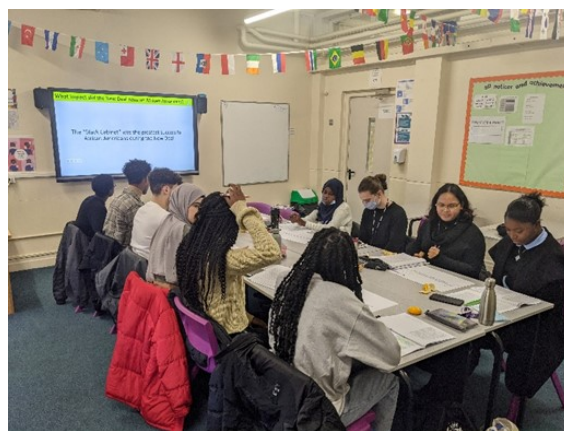
History and Politics

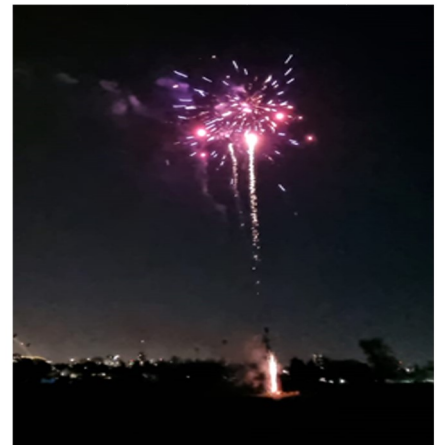
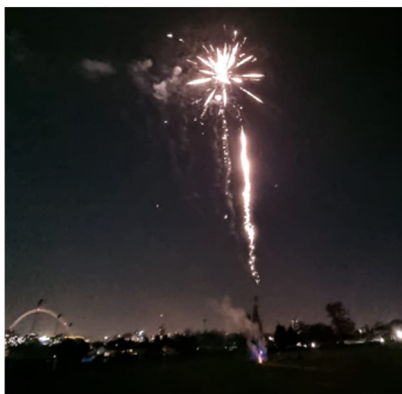

It's been great to get back to something like normality in terms of PE Extra Curricular Sports clubs and competitive fixtures this term and it's been fantastic seeing the huge numbers of pupils taking up the chance to join in, get fit and be competitive.

We have played almost 30 boys football fixtures in both the Brent Leagues and Middlesex Cups so far this season from Years 7-13 and every year group had some success. Our Year 8 team is flying the flag in terms of success so far, as they are currently unbeaten in all competitions and have progressed to the third round of the Cup - where they play JFS next week for a place in the quarter finals. All of the Year groups have enjoyed some successes though and there have been some fantastic games along the way. Unfortunately there was a defeat to Claremont in a penalty shoot out in their respective third round Middlesex Cup tie. Well done to all.

The girls have also begun to play some competitive football matches and are revelling in their opportunity to compete against other schools in this format. We have more games pencilled in in the fixtures diary and some local competitions coming up before we break for Christmas.

We have also been working behind the scenes to bring a local junior football club to PMS and have them based here and so I am delighted to say that Preston Manor School will now be the home to Kinja FC. They now play ALL of their games at the school site (girls and boys) and will be bringing their training sessions across too in due course. This offers a great opportunity for our pupils to commit to playing sport outside of the school day. I would encourage pupils who wish to do so, to get in touch with KINJA directly OR get this information from the PE department. There are some exciting plans afoot to develop our existing facilities too, but I won't elaborate until such plans become concrete.

We are moving onto basketball at school now, with the league games just getting started. Again, practice sessions have been really well attended, so let's see how the season unfolds. Please ensure you are familiar with our PE extra curricular timetable so you and your child can see exactly what is on offer.

The key to any real development though lies with pupils playing competitively outside of the school gates. There is so much potential at school, but not enough of our pupils play for teams at weekends. I have a host of local club contacts in a wide range of sports, so please let me know if you want them (I am constantly nagging and moaning at our pupils to go out and play).

We have also managed to secure a "guest speaker" -Arran Selhi, who has volunteered to come into school to help inspire and promote the benefits of sport and exercise to our girls. This is ongoing and she will continue to work with our girls throughout the year. We are hopeful that it will also lead to some further funding and development opportunities.

Rhia Benjamin from QPR continues to work with our female footballers (both in school and outside of school time). There is some real potential here and we are keen to tap into this and really push, promote and raise girls sporting participation at PMS

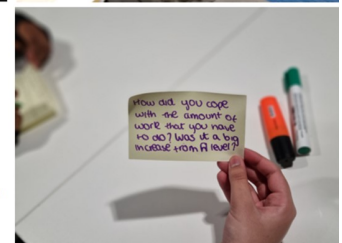
The D.I.V.A.s visited Brunel University to get an insight on higher education. They participated in activities, they were taken on a campus tour and talked about what they learnt about university.
