

<p>English <u>Genres:</u> ‘The true story of the three little pigs’- Newspaper report and ‘The tunnel’ –Narrative.</p> <p><u>Reading:</u> To continue to apply phonic knowledge and skills so that reading is fluent. To develop pleasure in reading, learning new vocabulary and understanding. To clarify meanings of words and answer questions about the text. To make inferences on the basis of what is being said and done.</p> <p><u>Writing and spelling:</u> Spelling focus will be to continue to learn different spelling patterns. Our writing focus is planning and composing reports and adventure stories including new vocabulary learnt.</p> <p><u>Grammar and punctuation:</u> The main focus this half term is to use expanded noun phrases and conjunctions for Subordination (e.g. when, if, that, because). We will also be focusing on progressive forms of verbs (past and present)</p> <p>Key vocabulary: traditional, narrative, fiction, expanded noun phrases, conjunctions and subordination, clarify</p>	<p>Maths <u>Measurements:</u> To use appropriate standards of measure, like thermometers to measure temperature, to measure capacity (in ml and l), mass (g, kg’</p> <p><u>Reading scales:</u> We will be learning how to read scales in increments of 2, 5 and 10, by reflecting on our knowledge of times table facts. We will also use reasoning to help us read scales with missing numbers and estimate points between different values on a scale</p> <p><u>Position and Movement:</u> The children will learn to describe position and movement in different ways including quarter, half and three-quarter turns. They will then learn to make patterns with shapes by moving them in different ways.</p> <p>We will continue to learn the 2, 5 and 10 times tables and the related division facts as well as revise previous topics covered throughout the year.</p> <p>Key vocabulary: position, movement, half, quarter, turn centimetres, grams, litres, millilitres, mass, capacity, volume, length, scale</p>	<p>Science This half term in science, we will complete all targets that we were unable to cover throughout the year.
