Key Facts and Events

Metals such as bronze, copper and tin alloy were discovered.

Innovations made including the ox-drawn plough and the wheel.

Invention of the potter's wheel.

Lived in round houses, consisting of circular stone walls and a thatched or turfed roof.

Organised government, law and warfare and religion began.

The first Art work. People used minerals, stones and bones to create art on cave walls. Colour was added by using charcoal, blood, tree sap and animal fats.

People domesticated animals and farms cereal grains. They made in tools, construction and art.
