

- •Communicate regularly



How can you prevent the risks becoming harmful?

·Develop coping strategies that foster resilience

•Keep the risks in proportion



How you can overcome inappropriate content

- SENSITIVE CONTENT
- •Ensure that they are aware that they can come to you
- ·Parental controls on home broadband
- •Safe search on Google (or other browsers) & YouTube; child—friendly search engines
- ·Content lock on mobile networks
- Talk about the importance of respect and the meaning of consent

- Never ever to meet up with anyone they don't know in real life




Tackling social media - Do they know?

- •Set up safe social media profiles that don't share personal information
- •Turn off geolocation settings on devices
- •Use the strongest privacy settings on social media
- ·How to report/block/mute



Cyberbullying





•Think carefully about sharing images of others

•Be responsible online, remembering they are creating their own digital footprint

•Report inappropriate posts/content to the social media providers

- •Talk to a trusted adult if they experience anything upsetting online
- •Think carefully about using monitoring apps that identify inappropriate behaviour
- •The T-shirt test if you wouldn't wear the picture on your T-shirt, don't share it online

KSI

Use technology safely and respectfully, keeping personal information private; identify where to go for help and support when they have concerns about content or contact on the internet or other online technologies

KS2

Use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly; recognise acceptable/unacceptable behaviour; identify a range of ways to report concerns about content and contact
