

<p><b>English- Journey to Jo'Burg – Beverley Naidoo</b>  <b>Genre - informal letter to ma-</b> Modal verbs, tense, cohesion, adverbials of time  <b>Genre - setting/character description, narrative x1-</b> Relative clauses, brackets, inverted commas, expanded noun phrases, personification  <b>Reading:</b> The children will apply their growing knowledge of new words to read aloud and to understand the meaning of new terms that they meet.  <b>Writing and spelling:</b> The children will learn to write legibly, fluently and with increasing speed.  <b>Grammar and punctuation:</b> They will be taught about subordinate clauses, paragraphs, modal verbs, relative pronouns and clauses, metaphors and similes  <b>Key vocabulary:</b> Adverb, myths, action, adventure, personification, setting, genre</p>	<p><b>Maths- Number-</b> The children will learn about place value  <b>Properties of shapes-</b> draw and calculate.  <b>Percentages/Decimals-</b> The children will learn about percentages, fractions, and converting between the three.  <b>Solving word problems</b> The children will be using addition, subtraction, division and multiplication. Using written methods for multiplication and division.  <b>Measurement:</b> They will calculate perimeter of regular and irregular shapes &amp; area of squares and rectangles.  <b>Statistics:</b> The children will interpret information in line graphs, complete, read and interpret information in tables, including timetables.  <b>Translation-</b> The children will be describing position.  <b>Key vocabulary:</b> fraction, decimals, number, division.</p>	<p><b>Science:</b> The children will continue their learning about living things and their habitats, building on their knowledge from previous years. They will learn about the life cycle of mammals, reptiles, amphibians, birds and insects and compare what they know.</p> <p><b>Vocabulary –</b> Mammal, amphibian, reptile, bird, insect, compare, life cycle, compare, investigate, conclude, describe, similarities, difference, classify.</p>
<p><b>Religious Education – What happens when we die [part 2]?</b>  The children will be learning about where souls go. They will be learning about what Samsara is. They will be learning how someone might reach Moksha and how people can find comfort after death. The children will also learn about Nirvana.  <b>Key vocabulary –</b> Nirvana, atonement, purgatory, soul, death, reconciliation, Moksha, Nirvana, Samsara, comfort.</p>	<p><b>History –</b> The children will be learning all about the Stuarts. They will learn that the English Civil War was fought between Charles I and Parliament. The children will be taught about the monarchs and their roles. They will also be learning about the war between the Roundheads and the Cavaliers.  <b>Key vocabulary –</b> monarch, decrees, depose, restoration.</p>	<p><b>Art- Cooking and Nutrition</b>  The children will describe the process of beef production. They will research a traditional recipe and make changes to it children will be learning the nutritional value to a recipe by selecting ingredients. They will be learning how to prepare and cook a version of Bolognese sauce [vegetarian].  <b>Key vocabulary –</b> cooking, bolognese, prepare, healthy, recipe, nutritional, production, beef</p>
<p><b>Computing –</b>The children will be learning about Spreadsheets.</p>	<p><b>PSHE- FEELINGS AND EMOTIONS.</b> The children will be taught all about anger and how to cope with different feelings and emotions.</p>	<p><b>PE –</b>The children will be focusing on street dance. The children will be learning how to move like excellent dancers. They will be learning how to create movements that show expression and creativity  <b>Key vocabulary –</b> movement, technique, expression, performance.</p>
