

### Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- To be confident to try new activities. (ELG)
- Explain the reason for rules and behave properly. (ELG)
- Show an understanding of theirs and others feelings and begin to control their behaviour accordingly. (ELG)



### Physical Development

- Reads aloud simple sentences and books that are consistent with his/her phonic knowledge, including some common exception words (ELG).
- Writes recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed (ELG)
- Writes simple phrases and sentences that can be read by others (ELG)

### Parents

- Provide phonics support for parents through Google Classroom and QR codes.
- Invite parents to share in their own customs/cultures with their child's year group.
- Encourage home reading with books sent home weekly.



### Mathematics

- Have a deep understanding of numbers to 10, including the composition of each number (ELG).
- Automatically recall number bonds to 10 including subtraction facts, some doubles facts and how quantities can be distributed equally (ELG)
- Is able to explore and represent patterns within numbers up to 10.



### Communication and Language

- Can express his/her ideas and feelings about his/her experiences using full sentences... (ELG)
- Offers explanations for why things might happen,...(ELG)
- Participates in small group, class and one-to-one discussions, offering his/her own ideas, using new vocabulary.



### Understanding the World

- Knows some similarities and differences between things in the past and now, drawing on his/her experiences and what has been read in class (ELG)
- Explores the natural world around him/her, making observations and drawing pictures of animals and plants (ELG)
- Talks about the lives of the people around him/her and their roles in society (ELG)
