

Curriculum Overview - Year 6 – Summer 2 2026



<p><u>English</u> <u>Text:</u> This half term, the children will write using a variety of stimuli, including pictures, short videos and extracts of texts.</p> <p><u>Genres:</u> Over the course of the half term, the children will write a short story, a newspaper report and an informal letter based on the various stimuli they are given.</p> <p><u>Reading:</u> This half term, the children will read, 'Floodland' by Marcus Sedgwick. They will focus on combining all the reading skills they have learnt this year.</p> <p><u>Grammar and punctuation:</u> This half term, the children will focus on revising all the punctuation taught so far, including passive voice, semi-colons, progressive tenses and subordinate clauses.</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> <u>Reviewing and applying all learning</u> This half term, the children will be reviewing and applying all their learning so far in maths. This learning will take them all the way back to the maths learning they did in Years 3, 4 and 5, as well as their learning from this year. They will practise answering a range of problem solving questions using their knowledge from different areas of maths to prepare them for high school.</p> <p><u>Arithmetic:</u> Throughout the half term, the children will continue to revise all their arithmetic learning to ensure they are well prepared for high school maths.</p>	<p><u>Science</u> This half term, the children's learning will focus on animals including humans. The children will identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system and they will describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood. The children will also describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans, before recognising the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function.</p> <p><u>Key vocabulary:</u> heart, oxygenated, deoxygenated, valve, blood vessel, vein, artery, impact, nutrients, water, circulatory system</p>
<p><u>Music</u> This half term, the children will be practising the songs for the Year 6 production in preparation for their performance in July.</p> <p><u>Modern Foreign Languages</u> This half term, the children will continue with their Spanish learning with Mr Montagut.</p>	<p><u>History</u> This half term, the children will be focusing on The Commonwealth. They will be learning about what The Commonwealth is and how it emerged. The children will also consider how immigration from The Commonwealth helped to rebuild Britain after World War II.</p>	<p><u>DT</u> This half term, the children's DT learning will focus on textiles. The children will develop their sewing skills to help them make additions to their production costumes.</p>
<p><u>Religious Education</u> The topic this half term is, 'What place does religion have in our world today?'</p>	<p><u>PSHE</u> The topics this half term are 'The Working World' and 'A World Without Judgement.'</p>	<p><u>PE</u> The children will be continuing with their outdoor PE learning on a Thursday and they will continue with their indoor PE learning on Tuesdays [6 Rowan] and Wednesdays [6 Poplar].</p>
